OBJECTIVES

- Check in on Student Leaders' progress supporting Research in the Round, the inaugural research roundtable event hosted at the 2022 International Convention.

6:00 pm Research in the Round Check-In

- Brett and Katie to check in on SLs who are partnered with Research in the Round participants, ensuring that all partnerships are moving without issue.
- Brett to offer relevant FAQ data to all SLs partnered with RITR participants:
 - Q: How exactly does this event work?
 - A: Research in the Round will occur on Thursday, March 31st, from 3:30 pm-4:45 pm, and will take place in Grand Salon Rooms D & E. Each researcher will host an individual table where any relevant materials they have prepared beforehand can be found. Participants will circulate from table to table in a timed, speed-style format, where (after a brief introduction) they attempt to answer the host's questions or may formulate one of their own about the same topic. The host should have follow-up questions in mind to prompt further discussion.
 - Q: How long I will need to plan to speak each round?
 - A: Each round will be limited to 8-9 minutes of discussion. Depending on the level of interest and the space available, hosts will engage in up to 5-6 conversations across 15 different hosts' research.
 - Q: How might I best organize my information?

• A: That's up to each individual host! It's a matter of how much ground you want to/should cover in 8-9 minutes of time. Some hosts might find themselves drawn to visuals like posters or a scannable QR code that directs participants to different online interactive items. Others might want to prep a series of talking points and follow-up discussion questions for anyone sitting in on their mini-lecture. It's entirely at the discretion of the host how their research is shared and disseminated with attendees; all we ask is that you submit content and materials ahead of time via the individual Google Drive folder links y'all received via email.

6:15 pm TikTok Submission Procedures & Deadlines

- SLs to be briefed on the new process by which the committee will submit content to the new official TikTok account for Sigma Tau Delta.
- SLs to follow step-by-step guide via the TikTok tutorial (filed under Teams → General → Files → "SL Committee TikTok Instructions.pdf").
 - Each SL should submit one test post to post privately on the Society account; Katie to verify when each SL submission appears on the account.
- All SLs to submit 1-2 TikToks over the course of the rest of the month please refer to the <u>online</u> <u>calendar</u> for individual deadlines corresponding to specific SLs' submissions.
 - Any SL attending the 2022 International Convention is only expected to record and submit one TikTok for March; any SL not attending the 2022 International Convention is expected to record two.
- Southern Student Representative Matthew Karshna to host an optional TikTok workshop and walkthrough for all Student Leaders interested in broadening their TikTok skills **next Monday**, **March 14th, at 5:00 pm CST / 6:00 pm EST via Teams.**
